THE CROOKED SPIRE: A NEW MUSICAL WITH A TWIST!

The iconic 'crooked spire' is arguably Chesterfield's most well-known feature. Now an exciting new musical will take audiences back to the time it was being constructed. *Kate Dawson* reports.

HE CROOKED SPIRE, a murdermystery musical, has been created by Ashgate Heritage Arts, made up of musicians and lyricists Martin Coslett and Peter Gray, who both live in Ashgate, and Mary Hennessy, an awardwinning playwright from Buxton.

Set in 1360s, the story follows John, a carpenter, who has travelled from York, having worked on the Minster there, to find work on the new spire in Chesterfield. Before

long, the master carpenter at the church is murdered and John is suspected of the crime. The only way he can clear his name is to find out who the real killer is. John discovers that poor workmanship is threatening the quality of the spire and that other

dark forces are at play. As he gets closer to the truth, he realises that exposing the real killer will put his own life in danger.

John makes new friends who support him, in particular a young boy called Walter, whose parents have died in the Black Death. Walter's elder sister, Katherine, a local seamstress, has caught John's eye, but audiences will have to come and see for themselves whether John uncovers the truth and wins the heart of a Chesterfield lass!

There are many theories about how the spire became crooked and the new musical explores one of the most plausible explanations – green wood (which has not been seasoned) being poorly joisted, due to the lack of skilled labour following the plague then, a century later, 32 tonnes of lead was added to the roof and the wooden

structure could not bear the bulk. It is also thought that as the sun shone more on the south side of the tower, the lead expanded quicker on that side, causing the spire to twist and lean.

The Crooked Spire musical has been adapted from a thriller written by Chris Nickson. "I'm

incredibly flattered that my book is the inspiration for this wonderful new musical.

I lived in Dronfield for a few years and visited the Crooked Spire as I was fascinated by its history; not long after, the story came to me in about ten minutes! I can't wait to see it being brought to life on the stage," he said.

The musical will star Gerard Fletcher

as Sir Henry, whose TV credits include roles in the BBC's Happy Valley; Netflix's The Crown; the BBC's Get Even and the upcoming BBC drama, Sherwood; as well as the role of Hud in Loaded, with the Reform Theatre Company; and Sir Toby Belch in Twelfth Night, at the Merlin International Theatre, Budapest.

Stephanie Putson, who played Billy's mum in the London production of Billy Elliot the Musical (2005 – 2016) will play Martha, John's landlady. Hayley Mitchell who recently starred in Northern Girls at the Pilot Theatre and The Fiesta Fawns, Middlesbrough Little Theatre, will play Katherine.

Playing the role of Sir Richard is John Conway, who played the Wizard in the Wizard of Oz at Trinity Theatre, Tunbridge Wells; and Starer in the film, The World's End; among his many acting credits.

The show also features emerging talent

such as Adam Stickler who plays John and who has dazzled theatre-goers as Henry Jekyll in a run of Jekyll and Hyde at the Alexandra Theatre, Bognor Regis.

Clara Coslett, who will come fresh from playing the beggar woman in Sweeney Todd at Buxton Opera House, will play the role of Beth, the master carpenter's wife.

Local singing sensation Eddie Waller, 11, from Brampton, has been cast as Walter. Eddie has performed with the Inspirations Theatre Company since 2017. Despite the lead up to the show coinciding with his Year 6 SATS exams, he can't wait to get on stage.

Eddie said: "Walter is a great character – he's very brave and a bit cheeky, but he looks up to John, the new carpenter in town and wants to win his approval.


"I feel very lucky and excited to have got the part. I can learn so much from all the professional actors and it's going to be amazing performing on the stage at The Pomegranate Theatre."

The musical's director is Jake Smith, who has worked on large-scale productions, notably Sting's The Last Ship, The Hounds of Baskerville for Northern Stage and a tour of The Legend of Sleepy Hollow.

"After reading the script, I jumped at the chance to be involved as I love staging amazing stories which have a strong sense of place. I'm also passionate about working with community theatre and creating excellent productions outside London," said Jake.

Musical director Harry Style, whose credits include Godspell at Bridewell Theatre, London, said: "It's an absolute pleasure to work with such talented performers to create something truly worthy of the West End stage here in Chesterfield."

Ashgate Heritage Arts was formed in August 2019 and aims to bring history to life through musical storytelling. Composers Martin and Peter met on Chesterfield's folk music scene – Peter playing with the

band Jig for a Kiss and Martin with the Brampton Community Band. Martin later met Mary, the company's scriptwriter, through a group called 'Writers in the Peak'.

"We're all passionate about telling wonderful stories through musical theatre and using the arts to engage local communities with their local heritage. The



Crooked Spire is our first full production and we're hugely grateful to Arts Council England and Derbyshire County Council for their support," said Martin Coslett, producer and co-writer, Ashgate Heritage Arts.

Scriptwriter Mary Hennessy scooped the accolade of Best Original Writer at the Buxton Fringe for her monologue Sounds Like The NHS in 2001 and rave reviews at Buxton Fringe for her shows Autumn in Picardy in 2019 and Argy Bargy in 2020. Mary has also produced all the medieval costumes for the show.

"It's a really great show with murder, mystery and music to keep the audience on its toes, threaded with humour which keeps the characters authentic," said Mary.

It's challenging for the audience and hopefully we'll have them on the edge of their seats as well as laughing along the way."
